Portsmouth Handicap System Scoring for Youth & Adult Divisions

Racing:

Every 1st and 3rd Sunday beginning 9/21/25 SYC will have two Windward/Leeward Course Races for all interested sailors with the 1st race starting at 2:00PM and a 2nd race to start immediately after all boats have finished the 1st . There will be two separate starts for each race. The first start will be for the Adult Division, and the second (about 5 min later) will be for the Youth (under 18)

Division:

Beginning in October 2025, SYC will also conduct a Fun Distance Race on the 2nd Sunday of each month-- touring the lake on a course to be determined that starts and finishes in the vicinity of the T-Pier at 2:00PM. Youth are encouraged to crew on adult boats during these distance races. These races will be scored using the Portsmouth Yardstick System but will not be included in the series scoring as the purpose of these races are to build esprit-de-corps, hone skills, enjoy the lake, and sail with new people.

"Eight Bells" Ceremony

October 19th 9:00am

Before chronometers, time was kept on a ship using an hourglass, sized to measure 30 minutes, and a bell. A crewmember would strike the ship's bell every 30 minutes as they turned over the half-hourglass. This practice evolved into the tradition of striking the bell every half-hour during the watch, increasing from one bell strike for the first 30 minutes, two strikes marking the first hour, and so on. A standard four-hour watch ends with eight bells, struck in pairs of two, hence the phrase "eight bells and all is well."

Today, the tolling of eight bells is often used to signify the end of a person's life or "watch on earth." In maritime tradition, eight bells are sounded during a burial at sea or an interment on land. Eight bells may also be sounded during remembrance ceremonies for someone who has passed away.

SYC's Ceremony

By resolution of the SYC Board in June 2025, we will hold an annual Eight Bells ceremony to honor members who have passed away in the past year. Our first ceremony will be held in conjunction with our fall regatta.

This being our first Eight Bells Ceremony, we will begin by recognizing and honoring all SYC members whose watch on earth ended prior to the current year. Attendees at the ceremony will be invited to call out names of these members, after which eight bells will toll for them, collectively. Thereafter, we will honor, individually, those who have passed in 2025. Those members we currently plan to honor individually are;
