CAPT. CURMUDGEON

Ask Captain Curmudgeon

I said I would speak more on flogging this month. I offer no defense of flogging which occurred on Navy ships. The existing conditions made it difficult to create effective sanctions for misbehavior. Sailors had to scurry about the decks barefoot, climb the rigging in all climatic conditions and were deliberately toughened up to cope with a life at sea. Food, recreation time and conversation were sacrosanct to them, and reduced diets, extra drill, denial of free time and solitary confinement in the ships' cells were resented by boys, and awkward to supervise, even if effective. It didn't work to just put them in "time out."

A sailor that would be flogged, would have to make his own "cat". "Cat" was a reference to the cat 'o nine tails which was normally kept in a cloth bag, and was only pulled out immediately prior to logging. Sometimes the bag was waived in front of a potential miscreant to warn him before the "cat is let out of the bag."

The phrase "no room to swing a cat" does come from the cat 'o nine tails. During punishment all hands were called on deck to bear witness. In the case of a ship with a full complement on board this could make for a very crowded deck. In fact, the deck could be so crowded that a cat o' nine tails could not be used without hitting the observers.
